

# BORDEAUX WINES

## CHATEAU PATRIS St. Emilion

Merlot—80% Cabernet Sauvignon—10%  
Cabernet Franc—10%

A great classical wine with soft elegant tannins but with the wonderful finish of a good St. Emilion. The grapes are grown in the cradle of the Merlot universe. Enjoy with spicy foods as well as traditional meat and cheese dishes.



## CHATEAU CORDET Margaux

Cabernet Sauvignon—60% Merlot—20%  
Cabernet Franc—20%

Ch. Cordet is deep ruby-purple in color with a nose of cherries, cassis, blackberries, mocha, vanilla and spice. Full-bodied with moderate acidity and well integrated tannins, the wine offers rich flavors of blackberries, crème de cassis, cherries, mocha, and mint. Soft, rich and velvety on the long finish.



## CHATEAU LA ROSE TREMIERE Pomerol

Merlot—65% Cabernet Franc—35%

This is an interesting wine for both the palate as well as the blend. Some oak after maceration treatment, which accentuates the fruit and gives brilliant balance. Soft, silky, and very soft tannins makes this wine complex and elegant. The grapes are from two vineyards. The average age of the vines is 40 years for one and 25 years for the other.



## CHATEAU MAZERIS BELLEVUE Canon Fronsac

Merlot—70% Cabernet Sauvignon—15%  
Cabernet Franc—14% Malbec—1%

Ch. Mazeris Bellevue has been with the same family since 1848. The vineyard is situated on the slopes of the St. Michel de Fronsac and enjoys the best location in the region. It has a deep black color with fruity aromas of cassis, blackberry and cherry. A perfect balance of strength, fruitiness and smooth tannins.



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## CHATEAU de FONTENILLE Grand Vin de Bordeaux

Merlot—60% Cabernet Sauvignon—30%  
Cabernet Franc—20%

This historic winery dating back to the 13th century still produces wines of superb quality and value. This lovely ruby colored wine is medium bodied with good structure, intense red fruit aromas with a touch of warm pepper and silky tannins.



## CHATEAU DE LESTIAC Bordeaux Blanc Sec

Sauvignon—60% Semillon—40%

The vineyard is located about 20 miles south-east of Bordeaux on the right bank of the Garonne in the commune of Lestiac. The average age of the vines is 10 years old. The cellars have been entirely renovated and stainless steel temperature controlled vats have been installed. The wine is aged for 8 months in vats and barrels.
